After many successful shows in Alberta and Saskatchewan, all you collectors have to drive to Austin Manitoba! I only missed one show and hope the distance is not going to deter members from attending the 2018 Show. The Board has not finalized a theme yet but anything IH is good for me.

I wish to request help from our Manitoba Membership to hopefully assist me in putting on as great a show as our past endeavours. The Board is of great help but we need that local connection to have a great show. Since joining Chapter 38 I have discovered that Manitoba has a large and loyal IH Community, not only tractors and implements but also trucks, toys and memorabilia.

I met in early December with two of the committee from the Manitoba Agricultural Museum, Erin Klym Massey and Elliot Sims, to prepare for this event.

The Museum requires that all exhibitors must register if planning to show at the event. All rules and fees are covered in these documents.

IHC 38 Club Memorabilia Sales: the club is allowed to sell its own merchandise free of charge at the show.

IHC-Related Vendors: private vendors that normally travel with IHC 38 will be allowed to co-locate with IHC 38 in their HQ tent. Private vendors will have to pay the commercial vendor fee (\$100 for the four days) and will not be allowed to sell used parts. New parts that are clearly in original packaging are fine to sell.

Friday Get-together: not a problem for us to rope off a few tables in the beer gardens on Friday late afternoon/early evening for the club to hold a meeting.

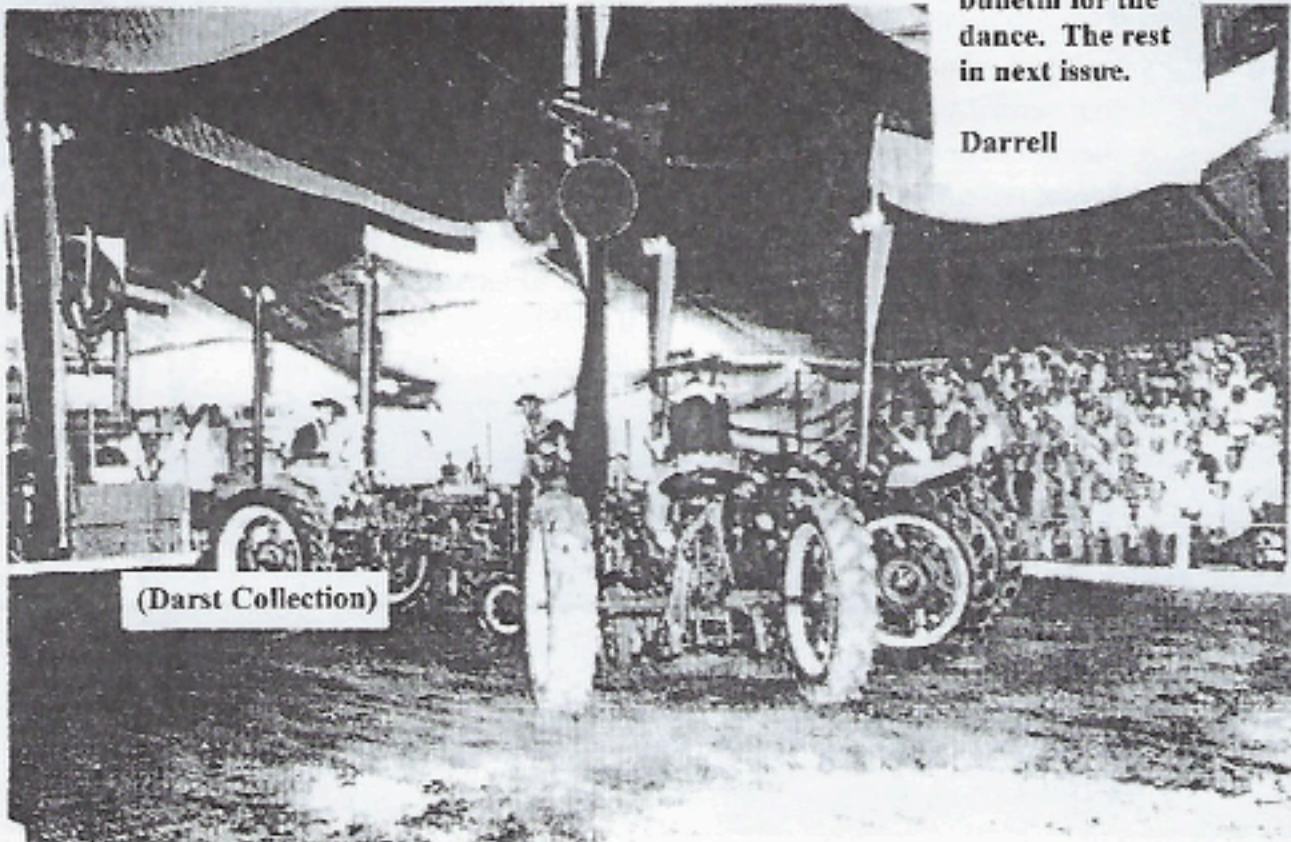

How To Stage a SUCCESSFUL SQUARE DANCE With Farmall Super C Tractors and Fast - Hitch

A lot of our clubs and members are attempting to do the original IH tractor square dance. This is the original IH bulletin for the dance. The rest in next issue.

GENERAL SUGGESTIONS

If you follow the instructions outlined here, you will find it quite easy to stage a highly successful square dance that will cause wide-spread comment and attract many visitors to your exhibits.

Equipment Required

Experience has indicated that the Fast-Hitch implements best suited to the square dance are the disk harrow, middlebuster, disk plow and platform carrier (with two 100-pound sandbags for extra weight secured to the carrier platform). If you use different implements, be sure they are stable enough not to fall over, and heavy enough so that they are not easily pushed backward by the tractor when hitching.

Attach chains securely to the two socket latches and fasten the chains to the seat so that the operator can pull up the latches easily when unhitching. "S" links used to fasten the chain to the socket latches can be welded closed to prevent their possible pulling out in the event considerable pressure is necessary on the latches in lifting. Be sure implement hitching beams and Fast-Hitch sockets are greased to permit easy hitching.

The tractors should have fluid in the front tires and one set of front wheel weights. If desired, rear wheels may be filled with about 30 gallons of fluid for better stability and traction when pivoting ... however, it is not necessary.

For stability and ease in pivoting, and for safety, rear tractor wheel spacing should be at least 72 inches. If an arena larger than the minimum recommended is used, wheel spacing may be increased over 72 inches.

Steering wheel spinners should be used to facilitate fast steering during the pivoting and for ease in steering while hitching. If the dance is held in an inside arena, tail lights located on the rear corners of the operator's platform and focused on the hitch sockets aid in hitching and also aid in focusing interest on the hitching operation.

Arena

Arena size should be a minimum of 45 x 70 feet. If possible, a slightly larger arena, particularly wider, should be used. If an outside arena, a post approximately 7 feet or

higher should be placed in the exact center of the arena. If held in a tent, the tent center pole can be used as a focal point for the tractors when "coming to the center". Arena should be roped off and audience kept at least 5 feet from the arena edges for safety.

Operating Gear and Speed

Tractors enter in third gear at full throttle. Upon reaching their respective corners, speed is cut to one-half throttle and this speed is maintained throughout the dance until the tractors pause after the last pivot ... gear is then shifted to fourth and full throttle is used on leaving arena.

Personnel Required

Tractor operators should be good drivers, preferably young and with a neat appearance. Dress them in distinctive costumes such as cowboy outfits.

The caller should be experienced. Added interest can be aroused by using a caller well known to your audience. Many states have calling contests, and you may be able to get your state champion.

The musical group can be any combination accustomed to playing square dances and should have enough instruments to be heard above the tractor engines.

Public Address System

Install plenty of speakers so that the music and the calls can be heard above the tractor engines. It is also suggested that you have some speakers outside your tent if you use a tent so that passers-by can hear the square dance in progress and be drawn into the show.

Music

It is suggested that "Turkey in the Straw" be used throughout the dance, since it is best known.

Rehearsals

Experience has indicated that above-average tractor operators can master the tractor square dance in a minimum of three full days of rehearsal. However, it will be best to allow a week for practice. You don't need to wait for your arena to be ready to start rehearsals. Stake out a dummy arena, install a small public address system and, using a record of "Turkey in the Straw", start your operators practicing.

Other Suggestions

If desirable, the length of the square dance can be extended by simply duplicating portions of the dance outlined here. Here is another idea . . . the dance is so unusual that fair officials will welcome it as an addition to their grandstand show. Contact your officials, invite them to see the dance, and suggest that they include it in their grandstand program.

INTERPRETING THE SCRIPT

Following is a complete script for your square dance, including the calls, a description of the tractor movements and additional diagrams.

The dance is divided into 20 basic movements. The four tractors are labelled A, B, C and D. The four implements are labelled w, x, y and z.

In the script, each of these 20 movements includes the following:

1. The call that starts the movement; a few movements have two calls.
2. A word description of the movement.
3. A diagram showing the position of all tractors and implements at the end of each movement.

Follow the script closely and your square dance will be a great success.
